What a great way to hone in on those 20 to 50 yards shots into a real green.

Also, who is interested in keeping the Friday points game going this summer? Scott and I love the points format and even have a couple twists to keep it even more interesting. This month's golf tip is about getting back to basics. Jack Nicklaus claims his instructor taught him grip, alignment and posture every spring after putting the clubs down each winter back in cold Columbus Ohio. You may need a grip tune up that includes drills to make it feel comfortable. Why do you come "over the top"? Maybe it's because your alignment is way right. Fix your aim and now the ball is too far forward and time to play your ball more in the middle of your stance. Why do I lift my arms on backswing instead of turning my body? Poor golf posture as people tend to move in a way that they stay in balance. Stand straight up then swing around your body. Try that and you may fall. Hips back and chin up gives one the best chance to turn and sweep ball off the ground. Grip, Alignment and Posture, the foundation of a good swing may be what lowers your scores.



Good afternoon fellow Picklers, hope you are enjoying this great weather. Last month I left you with "Zero-Zero-2" I bet you have been wondering what crazy speak that is. Well, that is how you start every Pickleball game. That is the score when you begin play, broken down first Zero is your team's score, second Zero is your opponent's score and 2 is the number of the serve.

So, this scoring thing in Pickleball is the most difficult to master. You will be playing points in no time but be assured the "score thing" will take a few weeks to really master. Here is a quick lesson:

At the start of the game your team only gets one serve to score points. As soon as you lose your serve the other side gets to serve. The rest of the game each team gets two serving opportunities.

TENNIS AND PICKLEBALLCON invest

That means in order to keep track of the server, each server gets a number, one or two. The server on the right side becomes server 1 and the server on the left side is server 2. So, when you call the score you give your score, your opponent's score and what server you are. Sounds easy right? The game ends when one team gets to 11 points and is ahead by 2.

It has been a fun month on the Pickleball courts. We have been playing just about every day from 8 am till everyone is too tired to continue. The crowds have been good and the play continues to be fun and competitive. Most days we have 4 or 5 courts going and a few waiting to get into the action. We also welcomed several new members to the courts. Seems like the interest in PB remains high.

We started an experimental cross club league last month and the response has been great. Teams from LaGrone Park, Pine Ridge, Sugarmill Woods and Rainbow Springs traveled to different locations and played team matches. The teams were made up of 2 men's teams, two women's teams and 3-4 mixed doubles teams. The format was playing best 2 out of 3 matches. 

Next time you tee off look at the hole signage and you will see red areas; those are waste bunkers.

Starting May 1st, we will be shutting down the back 9 (Pine Course for the Summer) at Sugar,

as we will be completing some much-needed work on those Greens, getting them healthy. I know they look beat up and poor right now, which is the result of a lack of proper culture practices in the past. Once we get a good growing season on the Greens, with proper culture practices, they will be just fine.

Over at Oak Village, we are sweeping the Clay Courts now, rolling them a couple times a week and keeping the weed pressure down. This off season, we will be fertilizing the turf grass, working on irrigation and doing much needed tree work.


